Bring a fresh new look into your home with the latest designs for all your furnishings. Nature-inspired patterns are key in 2010. From the pretty details of an English cottage garden, seen in Sanderson's Rosalie vintage rose print, to the bright palette of Thibaut's Gatehouse fabrics range. And look out for global influences, like the Moorish patterns in

Clarke & Clarke's Astoria Velvets and the Persian and Indian exoticism of Harlequin's Laika. Beautiful natural fibres are also on-trend, as seen in Natasha Marshall's Tuiga design for Wemyss. 2010's textures come from a desire to create elegance and luxury, such as Linwood's Tree design and Today Interior's Kariba II. Also important are silks and silky textures with floral embellishments, including embroidery and appliqué.

Flock is a theme that will continue, with a contemporary edge created by stunning colourways – as in Sophie Conran's Belle wallpaper and Zoffany's Persian Tulip. Metallic effects are also key, as seen in GP&J Baker's intricate Voysey Leaf design.
